The Healthy Start Coalition Partners With Ascension Sacred Heart on The Emerald Coast to Implement the M.O.R.E. Project

M.O.R.E-Maternal Opioid Recovery Effort

The M.O.R.E Project's purpose is to work with providers, hospitals, and other stakeholders to improve identification, clinical care and coordinated treatment/support for pregnant women with opioid use disorder and their infants. This project has allowed Healthy Start to connect and unite with Ascension Sacred Heart of the Emerald Coast to create a Mapping Tool that identifies Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) and other support services in Okaloosa and Walton Counties. Along with the Mapping Tool, providers will use the [5 P's Screening Tool](#) to initiate the Plan of Safe Care (POSC) that will connect resources to the mother for wrap-around services and support. Our goal is to broaden this initiative to the remaining Labor and Delivery Hospitals in our community that serve mothers on their journey to a healthier life for themselves and their baby.



Florida Findings



Drug-related deaths are the leading cause of death to mothers during pregnancy & within one year of the birth.



Most deaths (75%) occur after the baby is born and mother has been discharged.

Safe Sleep Surveys Go Virtual

We are excited to announce that we are transitioning away from using paper surveys to collect valuable feedback from new parents and are moving forward with an electronic version using tablets. We found that by having the survey downloaded on the tablet, we can capture the necessary data results in a timely and swift manner. In addition, it is easier for the parents to complete the survey on the tablets and more

efficient for the hospital staff members to manage. The Coalition invested in two tablets for each of our four labor and delivery hospitals participating in the successful Charlie's Kids - Sleep Baby Safe and Snug project. This beneficial project was launched four years ago to reduce the number of sleep related deaths.

PSA- Smoking and Vaping During Pregnancy

Healthy Start is so appreciative to have a wonderful partnership with Cumulus Media who diligently works with us to create on point educational Public Service Announcements (PSAs). Our latest radio PSA addresses Smoking and Vaping During Pregnancy, which has shown to be a large and concerning issue not only in our community, but nationwide. Findings show that Okaloosa County has 2x higher rate of smoking while pregnant compared to the overall rate in Florida. Nationally, 3.6% of pregnant women reported vaping during their pregnancy during 2016-2018. (Wang et al., 2021)

Healthy Start Has Been Making a Positive Difference for 30 Years!

Healthy Start is part of the umbrella and safety net for mother and child health in Florida. In 1991, the Healthy Start concept was originally championed by Governor Lawton Chiles and First Lady Rhea Chiles to address the alarming rates of infant mortality and precariously low birth weights in Florida, and also to remove systemic barriers to prenatal and early childhood health care.

Through the use of a widely adopted Universal Screening Tool, as well as a coordinated system of care that identifies risk factors and helps to eliminate the duplication of services, today Florida's 32 Healthy Start Coalitions provide services for pregnant women and young children up to age three.

and Wow.... What a difference Healthy Start has made!

Since we launched in 1991, more than 6.6-million babies have been born in Florida!

Incredibly, during that time, Florida has seen a 32-percent reduction of infant mortality.

To put it another way, if the death rate today was the same as 30 years ago, 638 more babies would have died last year.... that's approximately 30 kindergarten classes.

Can you imagine? We're just so grateful to have contributed to such a life-saving and positive impact!

By using a simple screening assessment, we're able to identify risks faced by expectant mothers, and respond to those risks with a variety of resources.

Last year:

- 136,778 pregnant women completed the universal risk screening, and 198,489 infants were screened out of 207,730 infants born.
- More than 129,000 pregnant women and 84,000 babies, and their families received a service from Healthy Start in any of our programs.

And for the moms and babies who received Healthy Start home services,

- 90% of babies were born full term (Florida average 89.4%)
- Infant mortality rate was 2.77 per 1,000 live births (Florida average 6.0)
- 100% were screened for depression
- 84% of mothers who smoked quit or reduced their use
- 87% kept their postpartum doctor visits

These statistics represent dramatic improvement in the health of Florida moms and babies – a huge impact, particularly when considering the resources that are needed to care for moms and babies with health challenges.

Healthy Start is truly changing lives for the better. Together with our partners, we're so proud to join in celebrating our 30 years of success, and in preparing for the future generations to come.

Chris Sprowls snags award from Healthy Start Coalitions

Florida Association of Healthy Start Coalitions CEO Cathy Timuta presented House Speaker Sprowls with an award to **recognize his push to extend Medicaid benefits for pregnant women from two months to one year.**

The issue was one of Sprowls' top priorities in the 2021 Legislative Session. "every baby should have the opportunity to be born healthy. And every mother should have the maternal health care she needs to set up herself, her family, and her child to thrive," Sprowls said after receiving the award.

"The Florida House is proud to stand together in support of moms and babies across our state, and we are thankful for the work that groups like Healthy Start have done and will do with our investment to bring vital health care services within the reach of more mothers."
