Supporting Breastfeeding and Pumping Mothers

Healthy Start is pleased to have partnered with Northwest Florida State College to install a Mamava lactation pod in the college's centrally located student center. The lactation pod is afreestanding, mobile

suite that provides a clean, private, and quiet space for students and staff members who are pumping or breastfeeding.

Breastfed babies are better protected from illnesses and infections due to the antibodies in the breast milk. Breastfeeding also reduces the risk of SIDS. In addition, women who breastfeed their babies have a decreased risk of breast and ovarian cancer. On average, 85% of women in Okaloosa and Walton Counties initiate breastfeeding after the birth of their babies.

Walton County Health Department's (WCHD) Prenatal Care Clinic gets an Ultrasound Machine

Pregnant women in Walton County who do not have access to prenatal health care insurance, are fortunate to acquire excellent care at the WCHD's Coastal Branch. Dr. Ronald Gavilan along with ARNP, Jessica Craig, and staff will provide prenatal care to approximately 150 women this year. Since the Healthy Start Coalition's inception, 30 years ago, we have been providing support to their prenatal care clinic. Ensuring women in the state of Florida have access to prenatal care is the cornerstone of Healthy Start's chartered mission.

Recently the county health department expressed a need for an ultrasound machine in the prenatal care clinic. The Coalition recognized this need as a necessity in providing critical and timely health information for both the physician and the patient and committed to investing in this endeavor. After considerable research on the part of the health department, they recommended the Mindray DC-70 Ultrasound System.

Being a certified Sonographer, Dr. Gavilan is thrilled to have this imaging device available to him, as it improves his ability to see the progress of the women's pregnancy and to diagnose problems, or lack thereof, early on. It also provides his

patients with the first glimpse of their child's face, gender, and beating heart.

In 2021-2022, Healthy Start provided 158 car seats and 210 Pack n' Plays to families in need



Simply Healthcare, a Medicaid Managed Care Organization, partnered with the Healthy Start Coalitions in the panhandle of Florida, to certify 15 doulas. Doulas are professionally trained to advise, inform, and offer emotional and physical support to a mother before, during, and after the birth of her child. Research shows that women who have support from a doula during childbirth were more likely to have better birth outcomes and lower the rates of maternal and infant health complications.

The Coalition of Okaloosa and Walton Counties had two candidates attend this training and they are now certified. Congratulations to Sonia Scott and Linconyer Baldwin-Campbell for their doula certifications. We will soon be referring Healthy Start clients, who have limited emotional and physical support during their pregnancy journey. The Coalition plans to increase the number of Healthy Start doulas so we can serve more high-risk clients with the ultimate goal of lowering our infant and maternal mortality rates.

Summer Access Meeting

In July, the Healthy Start Coalition hosted one of our semiannual Access meetings, a round table community forum, in Freeport, Florida. Because we continually hear, in the news and from the families in our communities, that the childcare system in America is broken and in a crisis, we invited the Early Learning Coalition (ELC) to be our featured speaker at this gathering. The ELC provides for coordination, integration, efficiency, and quality of early childhood services in Okaloosa and Walton Counties

Amy Minkewicz discussed the lack of licensed daycare in our counties, especially for infants. Part of the problem is the low wages for early learning centers' staff, which makes it difficult for centers to hire and keep quality caregivers. She noted that the state is working on initiatives to increase the standard wage for childcare providers. The state has also allocated additional funding that will allow management staff of early learning educators the ability to recruit, improve skills, and retain the early learning workforce. In turn, this will provide more care for the families in our communities.

Sharon Pierce shared that ELC offers Child Care



Resource and Referral services acting as the resource hub for families, child care professionals, and communities. This is a free service that provides parents with information on what they should be looking for in quality childcare and how to sign up for a waitlist. The ELC can also provide VPK eligibility and enrollment, financial assistance for childcare, and compliance and education for licensed childcare centers, along with keeping track of children's developmental screenings.

There were other great community representatives in attendance as well. Each person was given a chance to briefly share about their organization and the services they provide or any projects there are working on. It was very informative and full of great networking opportunities!


